What is a national heritage area?

- A designation, by Congress, that recognizes nationally significant resources and their role in defining a portion of the American cultural landscape.
- Heritage areas are based on partnerships
- National Park Service provides technical, planning and limited financial assistance
- 49 NHA's designated by Congress since 1984

Poudre River NHA

- The evolution of the Poudre River, as one of the foremost examples of a working river in the Western U.S., is a key component of the Poudre River's historical interpretation and its designation as a National Heritage Area.
- Story to tell: Native Americans, French trappers, settlers, irrigation development, water rights conflict (law), water exchanges, flow measurement, water quality, recreation flows, ecosystem health, transition to urban society.
